ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE CLOSING THE OPEN SEASON ON SAGE HEN AND SAGE COCK IN WASHOE COUNTY, NEVADA.

The Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County, Nevada, do ordain:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to kill, injure, trap, catch, capture, wound or destroy, or to attempt to kill, injure, trap, catch, capture, wound or destroy, any sage hen or any sage cock, at any time, within Washoe County, Nevada, during the year 1929, and the year 1930, save and except during that period of time during the year 1930 which shall in the year be designated as the "Open Season" by the State Fish & Game Commissioners of the State of Nevada.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

TO THE HONORABLE WASHOE COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION,

GENTLEMEN:

We wish to call your attention to the practice of assessing automobiles in possession of dealers in the city of Reno. A lump sum is annually assessed against each dealer which is intended to cover the cars on hand. As the motor numbers are not taken into consideration when these cars are sold and a new license is applied for the same cars they are again assessed resulting in a double assessment.

We recommend that the following reductions be made, striking the assessment from the rolls in the respective amounts after the name of each dealer;

Auburn-Nevada Co #132 West St. \$2000.00 Barbash, W.J. (closed) #23 West Plaza \$2000.00
Bath-Jordan Co. #100 Island Ave. \$2000.00 Bradner, C. M. #25 West Plaza \$1500.00
