Notice is hereby given that Bill No. 360, adopting Ordinance No. 220, entitled "An Ordinance prohibiting unauthorized parking of vehicles on posted parking lots and property operated, owned or controlled by Washoe County; authorized towing away of vehicles illegally parked on such lots or property at the expense of vehicle owners; and providing other matters properly relating thereto", was adopted on January 7, 1974, by Commissioners Rusk, Nelson, Pagni, Scott and Grow, all voting aye.

SUMMARY: Prohibits unauthorized parking on posted county parking lots and property; authorizes towing of vehicles illegally parked on such lots.

BILL NO. 360

ORDINANCE NO. 220

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING UNAUTHORIZED PARKING OF VEHICLES ON POSTED PARKING LOTS AND PROPERTY OPERATED, OWNED OR CONTROLLED BY WASHOE COUNTY; AUTHORIZING TOWING AWAY OF VEHICLES ILLEGALLY PARKED ON SUCH LOTS OR PROPERTY AT THE EXPENSE OF VEHICLE OWNERS; AND PROVIDING OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHOE DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. It is unlawful for any person not an officer or employee of Washoe County to park a vehicle on any parking lot operated by Washoe County or on any property owned or controlled by Washoe County in parking spaces specifically signed and allocated to officers and employees of Washoe County or on any property not specifically signed for public use, during such hours as may be indicated on posted signs.

Sec. 2. Each officer or employee of Washoe County shall park vehicles only in that parking space specifically assigned to him or her.

Sec. 3. Persons not in the employ of Washoe County may park in parking spaces on county parking lots specifically signed and allocated for public use.

Sec. 4. Washoe County parking lots and property shall be posted with signs in conspicuous and easily observed locations, stating that vehicles of persons parking illegally in spaces specifically allocated to county officers and employees or in locations not signed for public use will be towed away and impounded, upon the order of the County Manager, with the entire expense of such towing and impoundment to be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Sec. 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as prescribed by NRS 244.100.
