SUMMARY: Amends the Washoe County Code to provide specific procedures for licensing locksmiths and safe mechanics.

BILL NO. 780

ORDINANCE NO. 607

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE WASHOE COUNTY CODE TO PROVIDE SPECIFIC PROCEDURES FOR LICENSING LOCKSMITHS AND SAFE MECHANICS.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHOE DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. Chapter 25 of the Washoe County Code is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth in sections 2 to 8, inclusive, of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2.

25.2261 Definitions. As used in sections 25.2262 to 25.2267, inclusive, unless the context otherwise requires:

1. "Key" means a mechanical device used for operating a lock and includes, but is not limited to:

(a) A change key or a key designed to operate a specific lock.

(b) A manipulation key or a key designed so that when variously positioned in the keyways of locks will operate the locks.

(c) A master key or a key designed to operate a series of locks which are individually operated by change keys.

(d) A tryout key or a key that will operate a series of locks in a larger series of locks.

2. "Lock" means a mechanical device furnished with a spring and a bolt or with a similar contrivance used for fastening a door, strong box or other object and opened by means of a key or combination.

3. "Locksmith" means a person whose occupation consists, in whole or in part, of:

(a) Making, repairing or adjusting locks; or

(b) Operating locks by mechanical means other than those intended by the manufacturers of the locks.

4. "Permit" means a permit to operate as a locksmith or safe mechanic.

5. "Safe mechanic" means a person whose occupation consists in whole or in part of repairing, operating, adjusting or changing combinations on safes or vaults.

SECTION 3.

25.2262 Permit required.

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate as a locksmith or safe mechanic in the capacity of either an owner or employee of a business within the boundaries of Washoe County, unless that person first obtains a permit from the sheriff.

2. The permit required by subsection 1 shall be in addition to any similar permit issued by any incorporated town or city within the county and in addition to any general business license issued by the county.

SECTION 4.

25.2263 Application. The applicant will be required to submit information concerning his criminal and business background and such other information as the sheriff may require in order to determine the applicant's suitability for a permit. The information shall be provided upon any form which the sheriff designates. The sheriff may refuse to accept an incomplete application or other form.

SECTION 5.

25.2264 Issuance of permit, investigation; renewal.

1. Upon receipt of an application, the sheriff shall conduct such investigation as is necessary to determine the suitability of the applicant to operate as a locksmith or safe mechanic. The sheriff shall report his findings to the board of county commissioners and state whether he believes the applicant to be suitable for the issuance of a permit.

2. The board of county commissioners may direct the sheriff to issue a permit if it finds that issuance to the applicant will not present a threat or danger to the safety and welfare of the public.

The sheriff shall issue an identification card which will include the name, principal business address, physical description and a photograph of the holder of the permit. This card must be kept in the personal possession of the permit holder and shown upon request at all times.

Any change of address must be reported to the sheriff within 10 days after such change.

3. The permit will be valid for a period of 1 year after the date of issuance and may be renewed upon application and proper showing that the applicant is suitable for renewal.

SECTION 6.

25.2265 Fee. The applicant for a permit or a renewal thereof shall pay the fee specified in section 25.025 at the time of application or renewal. The fee is not refundable in the event of withdrawal of the application or denial of the permit. The fee includes the cost of the identification card.

SECTION 7.

25.2266 Revocation, emergency suspension.

1. A permit may be revoked or suspended if the holder violates any of the conditions of the permit or commits a criminal act which involves dishonesty.

2. Upon the revocation or suspension of a permit, the holder shall surrender the identification card and any other documents issued by the county which could be used as proof or evidence that the permit is in effect.

SECTION 8.

25.2267 Penalties. In addition to revocation of the permit, any person who violates the provisions of sections 25.2261 thru 25.2266 of this code shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500 for each day in which he is in violation.

SECTION 9. Section 25.025 of the Washoe County Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

25.025 Fees.

1. In the absence of any provision to the contrary, all fees and charges for licenses or permits shall be paid in advance at the time application therefor is made to the sheriff.

2. The following are specific fees, for annual licenses or permits unless otherwise designated, which must accompany the application for a license or permit:

(a) For any business, trade, calling, industry, occupation, profession, or event not specifically mentioned, the fee shall be \$48.

(b) Adult bookstores; adult motion picture theaters: \$121.

(c) Auctions and auctioneers: \$12 for a daily license, \$48 for an annual license.

(d) Charitable solicitations: No fee.

(e) Distress merchandise sales: No fee.

(f) Farmer's markets: \$48.

(g) Flea markets: \$30 plus \$2 per day for each space rented.

(h) Gaming: As set forth in Washoe County Code 30.390.

(i) Hotel, motel, auto court, guest ranch, guest house, apartment, mobile home park: \$18.20 for the first five units or fraction thereof and \$3.64 for each additional unit over five.

(j) Intoxicating liquors: Per quarter or fraction thereof:

L-1: Tavern license - \$121

L-2: Package liquor - \$72

L-3: Cabaret license - \$182

L-4: Retail beer and wine - \$60

L-5: Retail beer - \$18

L-6: Wholesale liquor - \$121

L-7: Service bar - \$60

(k) Junk dealers: \$48 plus an additional annual fee of \$5 for each vehicle used in the conduct of any such business; but a junk dealer not maintaining a store or yard in the county shall pay \$10 annually per vehicle used.

(l) Locksmiths and safe mechanics: \$6.

(m) Massage business: \$48.

(n) Outdoor festivals: \$364 per day.


(o) Photographers: \$48.

- (p) Private police and security officers: \$48.
- (q) Secondhand stores: \$48.
- (r) Sidewalk sales: \$30 per each 7 day permit.
- (s) Tear gas weapons, bombs and shells; sales at retail: \$121.
- (t) Tent shows, circuses and carnivals: \$300 per day.
- (u) Trampoline centers: \$48.
- (v) Traveling merchants: \$121 per month.
- (w) Vending machines: \$12 per machine.
