The public is informed that members of the Reno City Council, the Sparks City Council and the Washoe County Board of Commissioners, have been invited to receive a briefing of an emergency disaster exercise on Wednesday, October 19, 2005, beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the Media Briefing Room at the Regional Emergency Operations Center, 5195 Spectrum Boulevard, Reno, Nevada. This Public Notice is being posted in the event there is a quorum of any or all of these governing bodies, **no action will be taken on any matter during this time.**

The City Councils and County Commission will receive a briefing of the emergency exercise being conducted by various emergency responders in the region, including the goals and objectives of the exercise, an overview presentation on the National Incident Management System, and an overview presentation on the Regional Emergency Operations Center Inter-local Operating Agreement.

Public comment (limited to three minutes per person) on all matters will be taken at the end of the briefing period. Comments are to be addressed to the Reno and Sparks City Councils and the Washoe County Commission as a whole.
