

- ◆ Epi-News Is Celebrating 30 Years of Publication (1981-2011)

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Help Guide the Next 30 by Completing the Reader Survey

The Epi-News, an official newsletter from the Washoe County Health District (WCHD) specifically for healthcare providers, is celebrating 30 years (1981 – 2011) of publication. In 1981 the WCHD launched the Epi-News as a bi-monthly update for healthcare providers addressing various emerging infectious diseases and related topics. Currently, the Epi-News has more than 800 external subscribers and has broadened its scope to include topics related to chronic diseases, injuries, and maternal and child health. Since 2000 the Epi-News has been published on an *ad hoc* basis, going out when there are public health issues that need to be quickly disseminated to the local medical community. Also since 2000 the Epi-News has been able to take advantage of blast-fax technology to rapidly and inexpensively get information to its readership. During the most recent 5 year period (2007-2011), the Epi-News delivered 91 issues covering 52 topics in 15 categories.

Over the years Epi-News readers have often provided invaluable feedback that has been used to improve the publication and develop ideas for future topics. In recognition of this tradition and to ensure we continue to meet the needs of our readership over the next 30 years, we are launching the first ever official survey of Epi-News readers.
