WHY?

- Fees haven't been revised since the consolidation
- Performing services that aren't in our fee schedule

WHO?

• MGT Consulting





- 1. Define WCRAS' cost to provide fee-related services
- 2. Determine whether there are any opportunities to implement new fees
- 3. Identify service areas where WCRAS might adjust fees to better reflect the cost of service or to subsidize fees with WCRAS fund revenue to reflect other economic or policy considerations
- 4. Develop fiscal projections based on recommended increases (or decreases) to fees
- 5. Provide comparative data for what peers are charging for similar services



Steps Taken

- Identify all direct staff time on the fee-related activity or service
- Calculate the direct cost of staff time for each fee using productive hourly rates
- Determine indirect or "overhead" costs
- Compare total costs to the current fee schedule
- Costs and revenues are annualized by incorporating annual volume figures
- Recommend fee adjustments

Recommendations

- 23 fees recommended to increase
- 16 new fees are recommended to be added
- 8 fees recommended for removal
- 5 fees will have no change
