Nevada Humane Society

- Founded in 1932
- 2006 Moved in to shared facility with Regional Animal Services
 - NHS donors contributed \$4 million to the construction of the shared space, creating a world-class regional animal services building.
 - NHS prepaid the lease to 2041
- Public surrender agency for all Washoe County residents
- NHS operates an additional campus in Carson City with a contract to be the public surrender, animal control, and adoption agency for Carson City.
- NHS is a private independent non-profit. NHS does not receive tax-payer funding from Washoe County residents.
- NHS is the largest non-profit animal welfare agency in Northern Nevada






Nevada Humane Society is contracted to be the owner surrender agency in Washoe County providing a safe place for residents to bring their non-livestock animals.

NHS Intake Sources






Reno Intakes




What is an Owner / Guardian Surrender?

- Any dog, cat, or pocket pet owned by a member of our community.
- Surrenders are appointment based.
- NHS provides resources for individuals looking to rehome their pets and encourages individuals to rehome the animal outside of the sheltering system.
- If intake diversion is not possible, NHS surrender appointments include gathering behavioral and medical information about the animal.
- NHS ensures that there is the capacity for a certain number of emergency surrenders every day for those surrenders that cannot wait.
- In keeping with industry trends, NHS does not charge a surrender fee.






What is a Good Samaritan Stray?

- Unowned animals too young for WCRAS' Shelter Operations.
 - Kittens under 8 weeks of age and under 2 lbs.
 - Puppies under 8 weeks of age.
- Received directly from the public at NHS.
- These are the most vulnerable of Washoe County animals, often requiring intensive round the clock care.
- NHS receives no compensation and charges no fees.
- These are in addition to the early transfer of kittens and puppies from WCRAS.



Transfers

- NHS is the largest transfer partner for WCRAS animals
- In 2023, NHS transferred 87.11% of all live unclaimed cats and 87.44% of all live unclaimed dogs.
- NHS transfers all ages, breeds, and treatable/manageable medical conditions.
- As part of the original partnership conditions, NHS receives the right of first refusal on all dog, cats, and small animals for a mutually agreed upon timeframe.




Transfers from WCRAS

Outcomes -Adoptions


- NHS is one of the primary places people get their dogs and cats in Washoe County, but NHS also adopts and transfers out to Northern Nevada, California, and beyond.
- Adoptions ultimately drive how many animals NHS can bring in.
- In 2023, 92% of all outcomes for dogs were via adoptions




2023 Dog Outcomes




2023 Cat Outcomes








