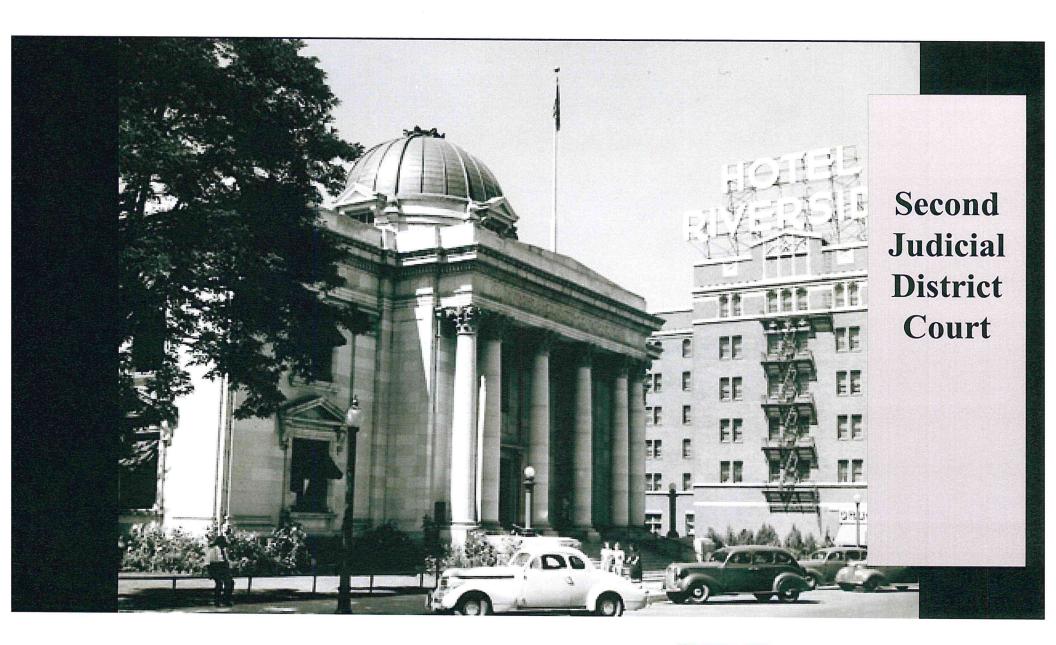
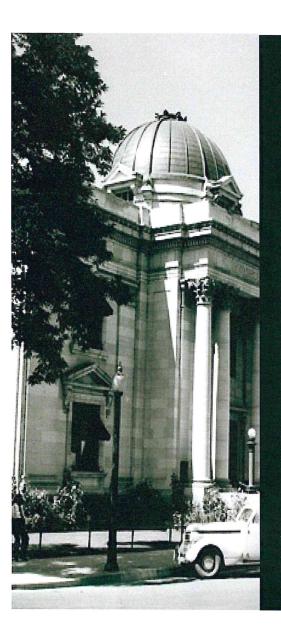

- Authorize county staff to work with Court to further develop scope of project and finance options



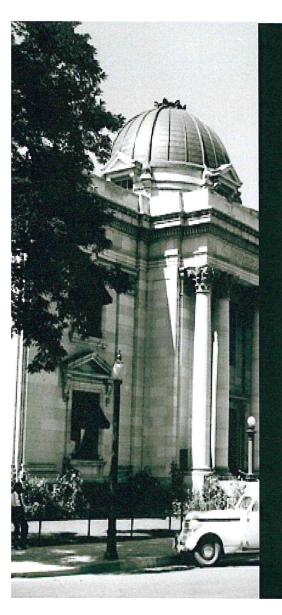
Current Courthouse





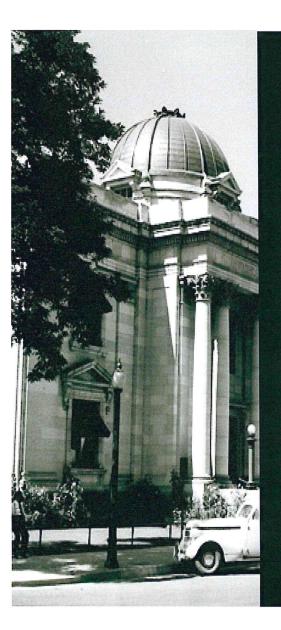
Courthouse Project History

Courthouse Project History

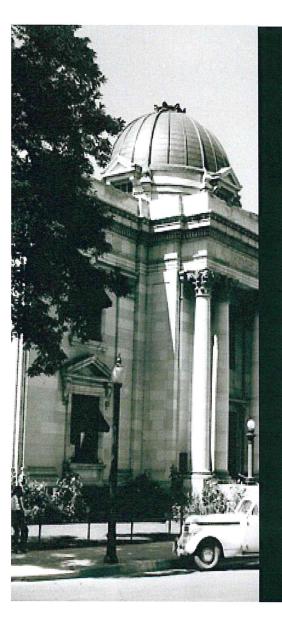
- Two master plans and a consultancy study in the past 20 years.
- Court has outgrown functionality of the building. Spatial, security, efficiency, environmental, technology, and code problems continue.
 - Court growth is approaching quickly
 - Maintenance and repair costs

- AB 64/65
 - Created by legislature in 2009
- Courthouse Pilot Project
 - Approved by BCC in 2012

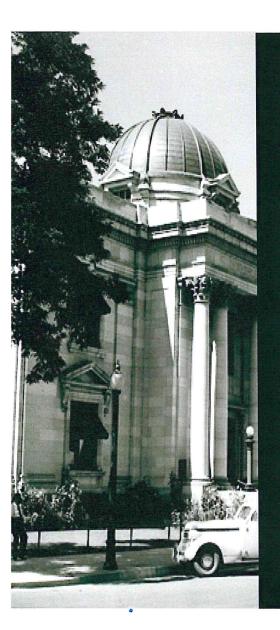
Current Balance: \$8 million



Security

- 2016 Security Assessment (National Sheriff's Association)
 - Various findings below best practices
- 585,000 visitors this year
- 351 security incident reports in last seven years (average is 50 per year)
- Co-location of public, court employees, defendants, victims, and witnesses
 - Substation area
 - Elevators/hallways

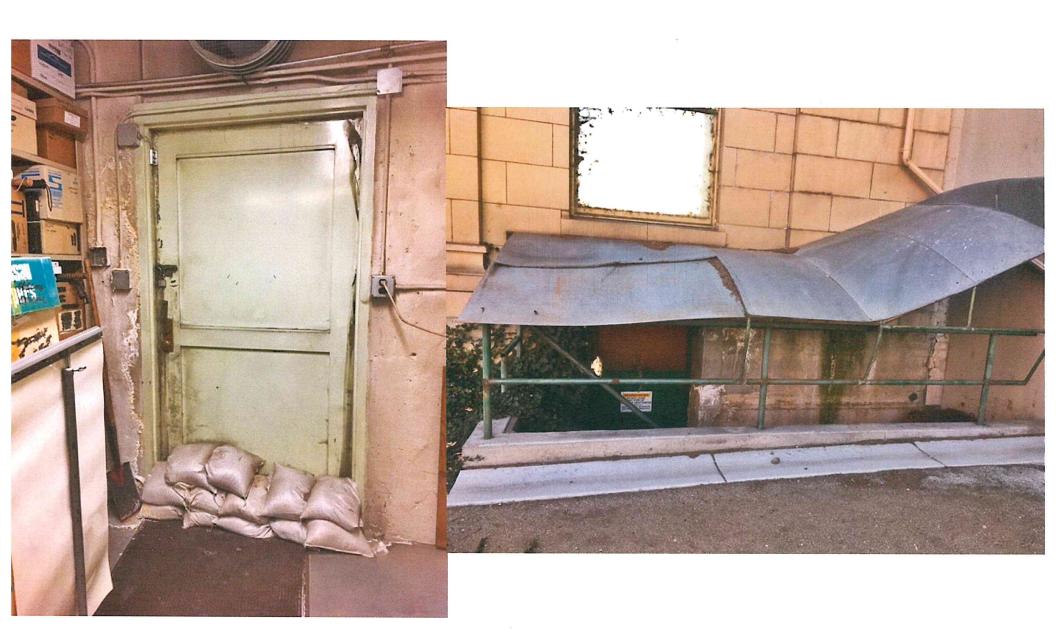




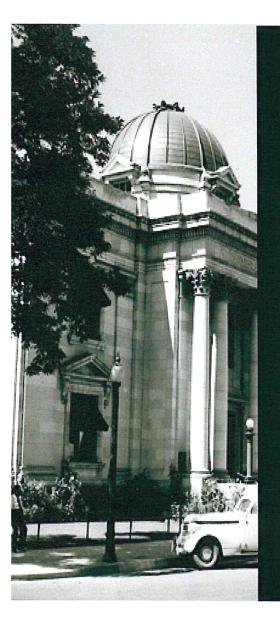
Environmental

- Environmental
 - Radon = 2x permissible levels
 - Remediation Expenses: \$200,000
 - HVAC
 - Space heaters, blown fuses, clothing adjustments
 - Water leaks and fire suppression









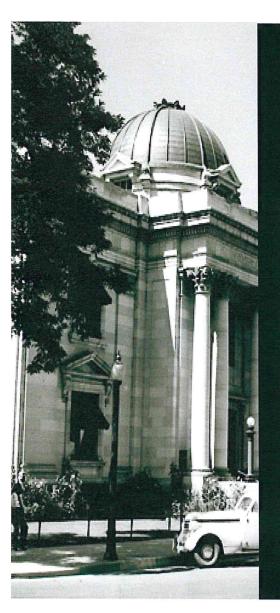
Ongoing Courthouse Project Efforts

- 2015 consultancy study by the National Center for State Courts identified two options:
 - Phased approach to accommodate current needs and defer long-term future needs, or
 - Single project to reflect current and future needs
 - Unify court divisions, operations, and economies of scale

Ongoing Courthouse Project Efforts

- 2017 Addendum report from National Center for State Courts, to include conceptual designs
- Legal opinion letter examining construction and finance options
- Review of similar projects in Nevada and elsewhere
- Consultations with public/private professionals
- Retained real property development consultant
- Developed draft of critical pathway details, including request for qualifications, request for proposals, methods for public and stakeholder participation, and financing timelines
- Ordered preliminary cost estimate report
- Periodic status meetings with County staff to exchange information
- Funded downtown County space assessment



Short-Term Goals

- 1. Engage regularly with County staff
- 2. Continue to explore a hybrid of traditional and creative financing options
- 3. Develop plan to interact with other government agencies and public
