- WHEREAS, Washoe County joins with local law enforcement, local and state victims' advocacy group, assistance organizations and the Office for Victims of Crime in the U.S. Department of Justice, to call for support for victims; and
- WHEREAS, More than 95,000 instances of violent crimes or property crimes were reported by law enforcement in a recent year, per the Nevada Uniform Crime Report of 2016; and
- WHEREAS, In Nevada a violent crime occurred every 26 minutes, 32 seconds, a property crime occurred every 4 minutes, 38 seconds during a recent year according to the UCR of 2016; and
- WHEREAS, Crime Victim's Rights Week serves to recognize the needs of crime victims and the importance of securing their voice and rights; and
- WHEREAS, this sentiment is embodied in this year's national theme, "Expand the Circle, Reach All Victims;" and
- WHEREAS, We believe victims of crime should always be treated with fairness and respect throughout the criminal justice process, protected from the defendant, reasonably head at public proceedings regarding their case, and given a voice through the process of their case; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the Washoe County Board of Commissioners does hereby proclaim April 8, 2018 through April 14, 2018 as
