Time Limits. Public comments are welcomed during the Public Comment periods for all matters, whether listed on the agenda or not, and are limited to two minutes per person. Persons are invited to submit comments in writing on the agenda items and/or attend and make comment on that item at the Safety Committee meeting. Persons may not allocate unused time to other speakers.

Forum Restrictions and Orderly Conduct of Business. The Safety Committee conducts the business of Washoe County and its citizens during its meetings. The presiding officer may order the removal of any person whose statement or other conduct disrupts the orderly, efficient or safe conduct of the meeting. Warnings against disruptive comments or behavior may or may not be given prior to removal. The viewpoint of a speaker will not be restricted, but reasonable restrictions may be imposed upon the time, place and manner of speech. Irrelevant and unduly repetitious statements and personal attacks which antagonize or incite others are examples of speech that may be reasonably limited.

Responses to Public Comments. The Safety Committee can deliberate or take action only if a matter has been listed on an agenda properly posted prior to the meeting. During the public comment period, speakers may address matters listed or not listed on the published agenda. The Open Meeting Law does not expressly prohibit responses to public comments by the Safety Committee. However, responses from the Safety Committee to unlisted public comment topics could become deliberation on a matter without notice to the public. On the advice of legal counsel and to ensure the public has notice of all matters the Safety Committee will consider, the Safety Committee may choose not to respond to public comments, except to correct factual inaccuracies, ask for County staff action or to ask that a matter be listed on a future agenda. The Safety Committee may do this either during the public comment item or during the following item: "Topics for Future Agendas".

Celeste Wallick directed the Committee’s attention to pages 6 through 11 and asked for any questions or recommendations. Victoria Nicolson-Hornblower asked about the employee with restricted duties of 238 days and if the person was still on restricted duty.

Ben West stated that the needle sticks after going down, have increased again. Victoria Nicolson-Hornblower informed the Committee that these are associated with the activity at the vaccination pods.

Deputy Vander-Heyden noted that claims and incidents are down from last year.

No recommendations were offered by the Committee.

5. Discussion and possible action of Code 65 updates

Ben West stated that he spoke to the District Attorney’s office on this matter. They will get back on it to get it submitted to the Manager’s Office. This item to be tabled for the next meeting.

6. For possible action, a discussion and recommendations on the update of COVID-19 activities and safety concerns

Ben West informed the Committee that there is a recent change to the rules for the 9th Street Complex based on recent changes on mask policy based on CDC guidelines. There will be a slight change in the signage at 9th and Wells stating the people that have been vaccinated can enter, those who have not been vaccinated should be masked. Building B – primarily WIC and clinic entrance will continue to require masks for those entering Building B.

Effective June 1, lobby screening will stop. Effective July 1, the 9th and Wells complex will be back to pre-COVID coverage.

Departments can be more restrictive if they choose. The courts are planning to enforce mask requirements.

Ben West also stated that traffic flow in the parking lot is being addressed with regard to the Reno Rodeo and vaccination activity.

Deputy Vander-Heyden stated that the Sheriff’s office is also following CDC guidelines, masks if not vaccinated, no mask if vaccinated with temperatures no longer being taken.

7. For possible action, a discussion on the dissemination of safety information and giving Ben West full authority from the committee to determine the contact and timing of release of information.

Ben West will start working with the communications team on July 1st and visiting them once a month on safety matters. The information will be available on Yammer, Inside Washoe, etc.

Celeste Wallick recommended that the Safety policies be released as soon as the Board of County Commissioner’s approves the updates.

Deputy Vander-Heyden agreed that posting a message on a monthly basis for all Washoe County entities would be beneficial.
