Warnings against disruptive comments or behavior may or may not be given prior to removal. The viewpoint of a speaker will not be restricted, but reasonable restrictions may be imposed upon the time, place and manner of speech. Irrelevant and unduly repetitious statements and personal attacks which antagonize or incite others are examples of speech that may be reasonably limited.

Responses to Public Comments. The Safety Committee can deliberate or take action only if a matter has been listed on an agenda properly posted prior to the meeting. During the public comment period, speakers may address matters listed or not listed on the published agenda. The Open Meeting Law does not expressly prohibit responses to public comments by the Safety Committee. However, responses from the Safety Committee to unlisted public comment topics could become deliberation on a matter without notice to the public. On the advice of legal counsel and to ensure the public has notice of all matters the Safety Committee will consider, the Safety Committee may choose not to respond to public comments, except to correct factual inaccuracies, ask for County staff action or to ask that a matter be listed on a future agenda. The Safety Committee may do this either during the public comment item or during the following item: "Topics for Future Agendas".

2. Public Comment

There was no response to the call for public comment.

3. <u>For possible action, resignation of Deputy Vander-Heyden and appointment of Deputy Mark</u> Kester to the Safety Committee.

Deputy Vander-Heyden announced she will be resigning from the Washoe County Sheriff's Office effective April 7, 2022 and that Deputy Mark Kester has agreed to take her place. Celeste Wallick asked if the association has agreed that Deputy Kester would be their representative. Deputy Vander-Heyden has not reached out to them yet, but will and will forward their agreement to







Celeste Wallick at Ms. Wallick's request. Celeste Wallick will follow up with the head of the association, Deputy (Jason) Lesher. if necessary. Cathy Hill accepted the resignation and nominated the appointment of Deputy Kester. Celeste Wallick seconded the nomination. The motion passed unanimously. Cathy Hill assumed control of the meeting and thanked Deputy Vander-Heyden for her service. Deputy Vander-Heyden was asked to stay to complete the quorum for this meeting without Deputy Kester present and agreed. The committee recognized Deputy Vander-Heyden's contributions to the Safety Committee.

Open Issues

4. For possible action, appointment of Chair for the Safety Committee.

Cathy Hill nominated Ben West as Chair of Safety Committee. Anne Stoll-Truelock seconded. The motion passed unanimously. Cathy Hill asked Ben West to take over the meeting as the new Chair. Due to technical issues Ben West asked Cathy Hill to temporarily assume lead for the meeting.

5. For possible action, a review and approval of the Washoe County Safety Committee meeting minutes of November 18, 2021.

Anne Stoll-Truelock made a motion to accept the minutes of November 18, 2021 as they stand. Deputy Vander-Heyden seconded. There were no comments from the public on this item. Motion passed unanimously.

6. For possible action, a presentation of Industrial Injury Summary Reports and recommendations of the Committee for prevention of work related injuries or illnesses.

Celeste directed the Committee's attention to pages 6-15. Celeste Wallick noted that the reports were longer than normal due to the missed meeting in January. Deputy Vander-Hayden and Cathy Hill noted the unique claims filed. Celeste Wallick noted that these are all claims filed whether denied or not as some of the claims are personal responsibility and not within purview of County responsibility. Cathy Hill questioned the amount of claims increase in comparison to last year, specifically in Human Services and Library departments. Celeste will look into possible explanations and report the findings at the next meeting.

Ben West has rectified his technical issues and assumed duties as Chair.

7. For possible action, a discussion on the Code 65 updates.

Ben West informed the Committee that the item is still on standby and there have been other concerns taking up BCC time, he is shooting for mid-April to get on agenda for BCC.

Kellisa Shirane questioned whether or not the Code Red system would work with Vonage. Ben West has done tests and as long as Vonage is installed on employee's computer and the app is open the Code Red messages will go through.
