Ms. Esp noted the data sharing agreement was updated this past week and no longer requires agencies to get permission to publish. Most of the items are the normal day to day operations, as we look forward to more strategic planning in the future, where the plan will come back to this group in the spring for review and any additions or changes the Board would like to have made. We are watching closely as regionalization talks are occurring to make sure we incorporate any items that would be impacted by regionalization are included in the strategic plan, to keep us more accountable as we move forward as a region.

Mr. Dick commented on the special projects in regard to the boundary drops. It is important to clarify that the report was finalized internally for external partner review, but is not yet finalized as a document, as we are in that process at this point.

6. Presentation, discussion and possible approval for distribution of the Washoe County Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Oversight Program FY22 Annual Report (For Possible Action).

Sabrina Brasuell

Ms. Brasuell presented the Washoe County Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Oversight Program FY22 Annual Report. She noted in past years, there was just one that was a combination of several years, due to the pandemic and the nature of the environment at the time. This report is exclusive to FY22. Ms. Brasuell pointed out that the report is intended to be educational and informational, so that the larger community can recognize the EMS system performance in general and have some more affectivity and availability of information. Ms. Brasuell noted on page 32, on the table specific to Sparks, that the prioritization system is specific to the Sparks Fire Department, so the classifications of 1, 2 and 3 and the text associated with it show no uncertainty. For awareness, the document is continually in the works, as this is a new approved template.

Mr. Dick commented that he appreciated the inclusion of the information on the overdoses, which he found quite helpful.

Mr. Dick made a motion to accept the Washoe County Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Oversight Program FY22 Annual Report, with the recommendation a copy of the report is provided to Krysti Smith, so that she may provide to Federal Engineering for their information in the regionalization talks. EMS OPERATIONS UPDATES

Training Update

New firefighter interviews were held in October. Seven personnel were selected with five of the new recruits starting the Sparks Fire Academy on 2/13/2023. Graduation for the five recruits will be in May 2023. The remaining recruits are attending TMCC's paramedic program and will complete their training prior to entering the Sparks Fire Academy projected for the fall 2023.

Two Sparks Fire Department (SFD) personnel have completed six months of the joint hybrid paramedic program at the Truckee Meadows Community College. These SFD personnel are in addition to the new recruits attending a separate TMCC paramedic program. This program is a new paramedic program for existing firefighters.

In-house ACLS & PALS courses were provided in October to paramedic personnel. Additionally, SFD paramedic personnel attended paramedic refreshers provided by Truckee Meadows Fire & Rescue, North Lake Tahoe Fire Protection District, and REMSA.

State EMS re-certifications are underway with approximately 50% of the department renewing their EMS credentials this year. This recertification cycle is a combination of Advanced Emergency Medical Technician's (AEMT) and paramedics.

Lucas Devices- In January 2023, the SFD received six Lucas devices following the approval of the Sparks City Manager and City Council. Training and implementation are scheduled in February. This will be a joint training with REMSA and SFD personnel to learn proper procedures and the most efficient application methods when co-responding to these critical incidents. The automated CPR devices will be available on front line apparatus serving all City of Sparks fire districts.

Ambulance Updates

The SFD is preparing to enhance our paramedic service level through the purchase of two ambulances. The first ambulance is in production at the Braun Northwest manufacturer in Chehalis, Washington with an expected delivery date in the fall 2023. The second ambulance was awarded through the Assistance to Firefighters Grants Program and will be sent to bid in March 2023.

EMS OPERATIONS UPDATES

RFD held an in-house AEMT program for 29 firefighters and had a 100% success rate for passing the national registry skills portion of the testing process. We also graduated our first lateral academy and added 4 more Paramedic level firefighters to our staff. All four of them have successfully completed their EMS preceptorships. 6 paramedics and 6 AEMT's started their EMS preceptorships in September and successfully completed them in October. 2 van ambulances were ordered with an expected delivery date of February 2023. Single role paramedic positions have been approved after GEMT funding was acquired. 6 paramedic (non-suppression) job announcements will go out in January.
