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Antique (Antique Wood Stove) Provide proof the wood stove was built before 1940 that has an ornate construction and submit current market value (appraisal) substantially higher than a common wood stove manufactured in the same time period.  □ A photo of the antique stove □ Appraisal from a licensed appraiser			
<u>Cook Stove</u> – Wood stove installed in the kitchen of a residential property, which is primarily designed for cooking and has a stovetop and an oven.  □ A photo of the cook stove (demonstrating the device is in the kitchen)			
<ul> <li>Previously Certified Device - For a property going through an escrow transaction, if the wood heater was a certified EPA wood heater device <u>at the time of installation</u>, it can be approved to stay on the property if the following requirements are met:</li> <li>1. The submittal of a complete &amp; accurate inspections report from a certified wood-burning device inspector on the form provided and accompanied by the following documents:</li> </ul>			
<ul> <li>A photo of the manufacturer's permanent label attached to the wood heater</li> <li>Documentation certifying compliance with the EPA certification standard at the time of installation</li> <li>A valid building permit documenting the date of installation</li> <li>The documents shall be submitted to the Control Officer as part of the Certificate of Compliance Process</li> </ul>			
<ul> <li>One-Time Exemptions - For a property going through an escrow transaction, if the wood heater cannot be verified as a certified EPA wood heater, <u>and</u> the removal of the wood heater would cause damage* to the property, <u>one-time exemption</u> for removal may be granted, if the following requirements are met:</li> <li>The submittal of a complete &amp; accurate inspections report from a certified wood-burning device inspector on the form provided and accompanied by the following documents:</li> </ul>			
<ul> <li>□ A report from a licensed contractor indicating that damage will be caused in the process of removing the wood heater</li> <li>□ Photos of the wood heater as evidence that damage would occur during any removal</li> <li>2. Documentation shall be submitted to the Control Officer as part of the Certificate of Compliance process</li> </ul>			

\*<u>Damage</u> – means any work that would require the use of equipment, as determined by a licensed contractor, to break masonry, brick or tile in order to remove the wood-burning device, and the condition after removal is not repaired to a level equivalent to the condition before removal.
