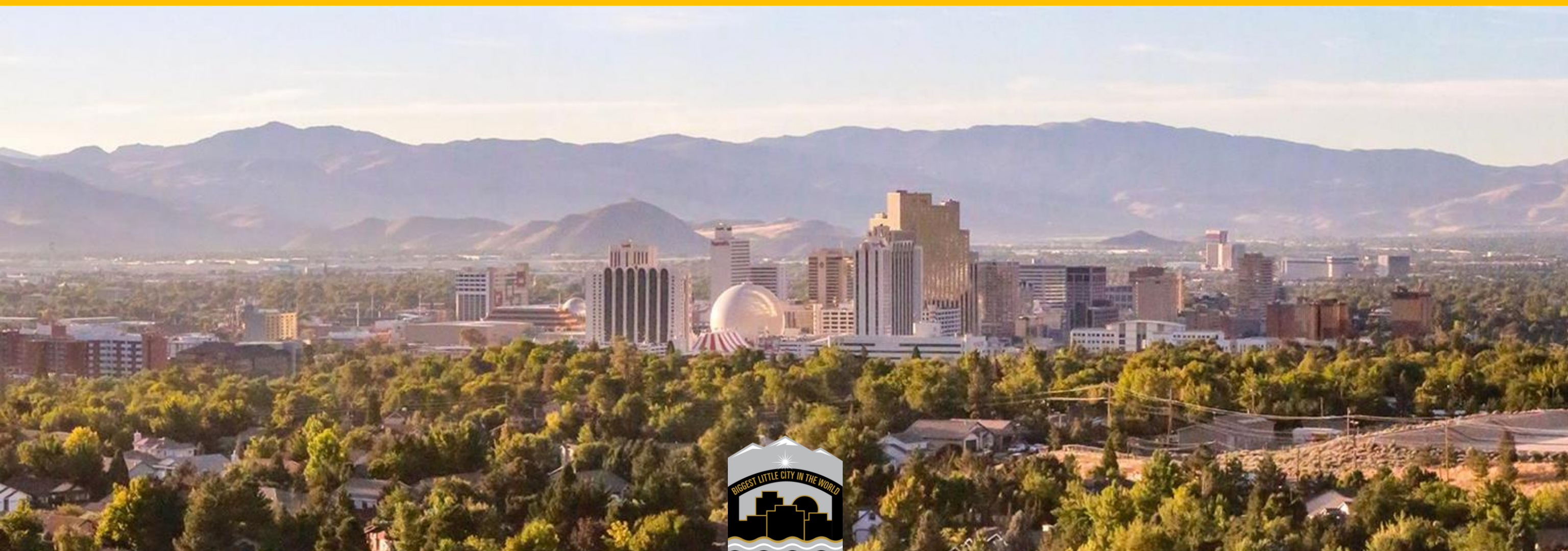

Interdepartmental team established to address the ongoing public health and safety emergency along the river.



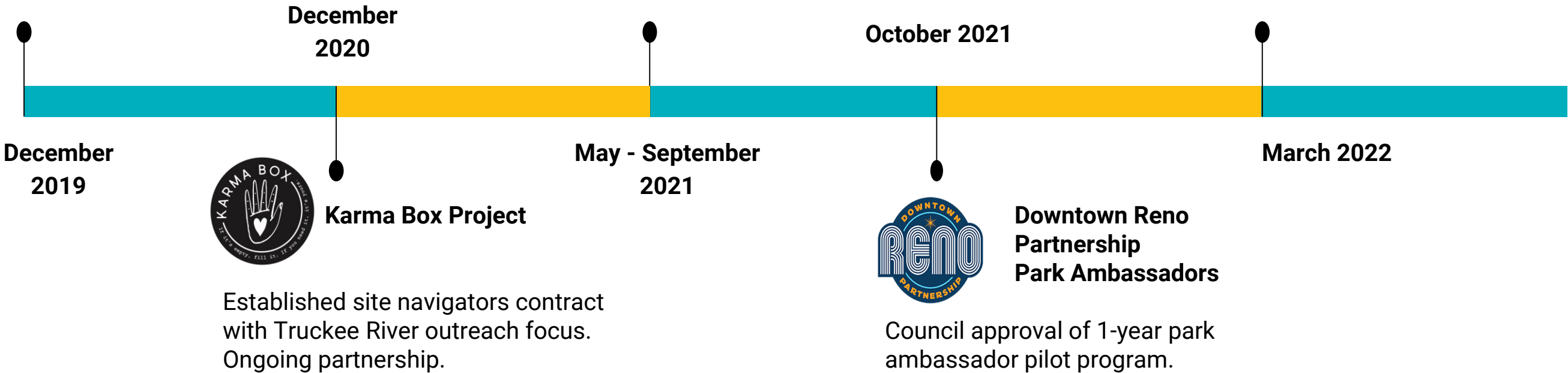
Truckee River Operation

Coordinated effort to restore the corridor's natural habitat.



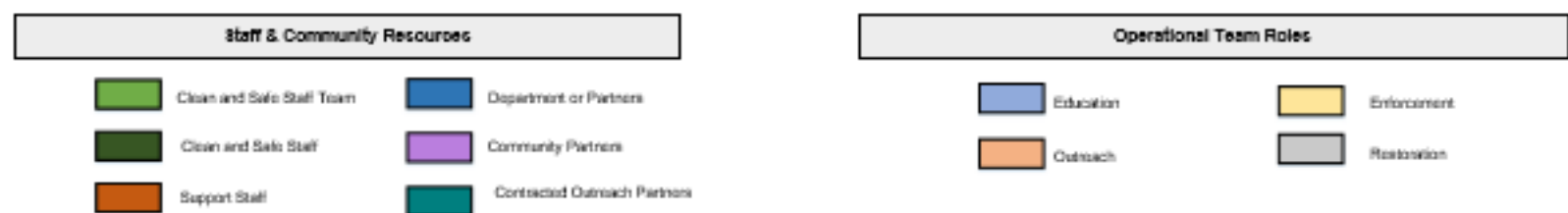
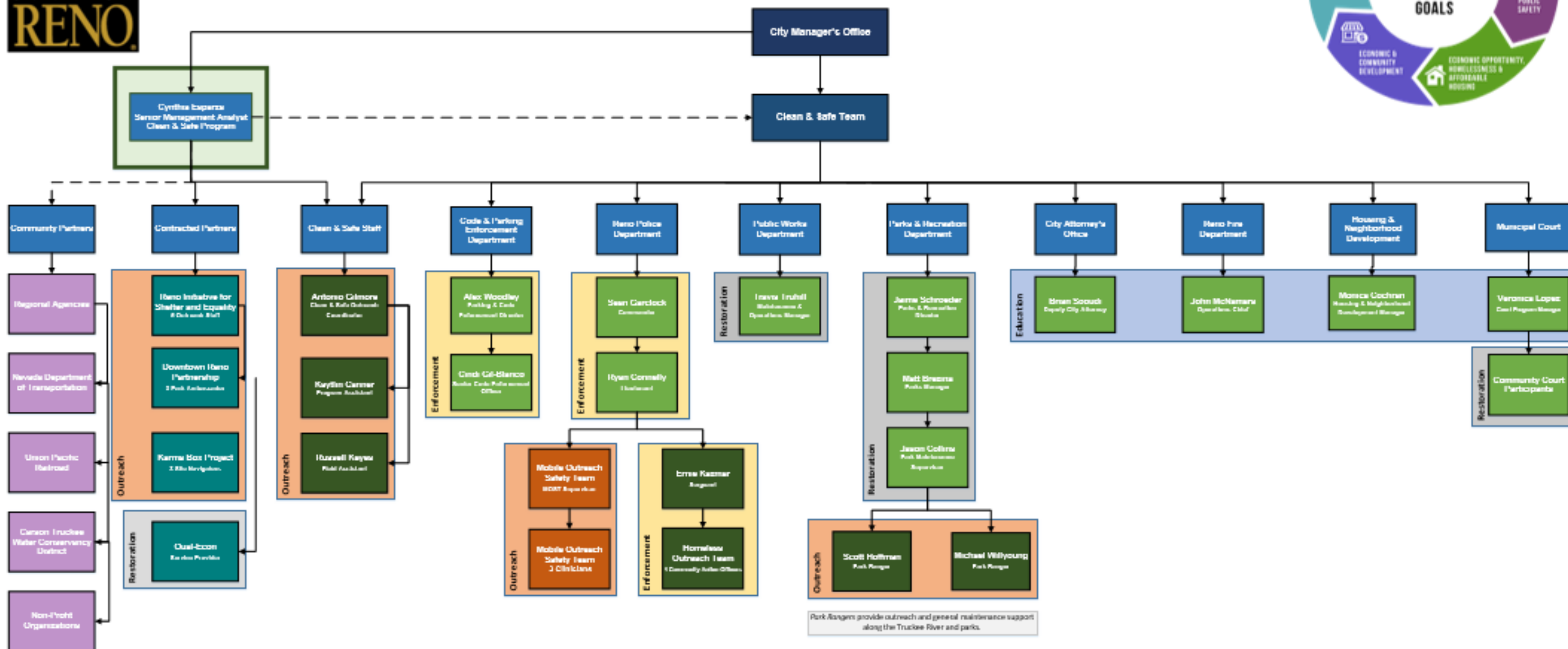

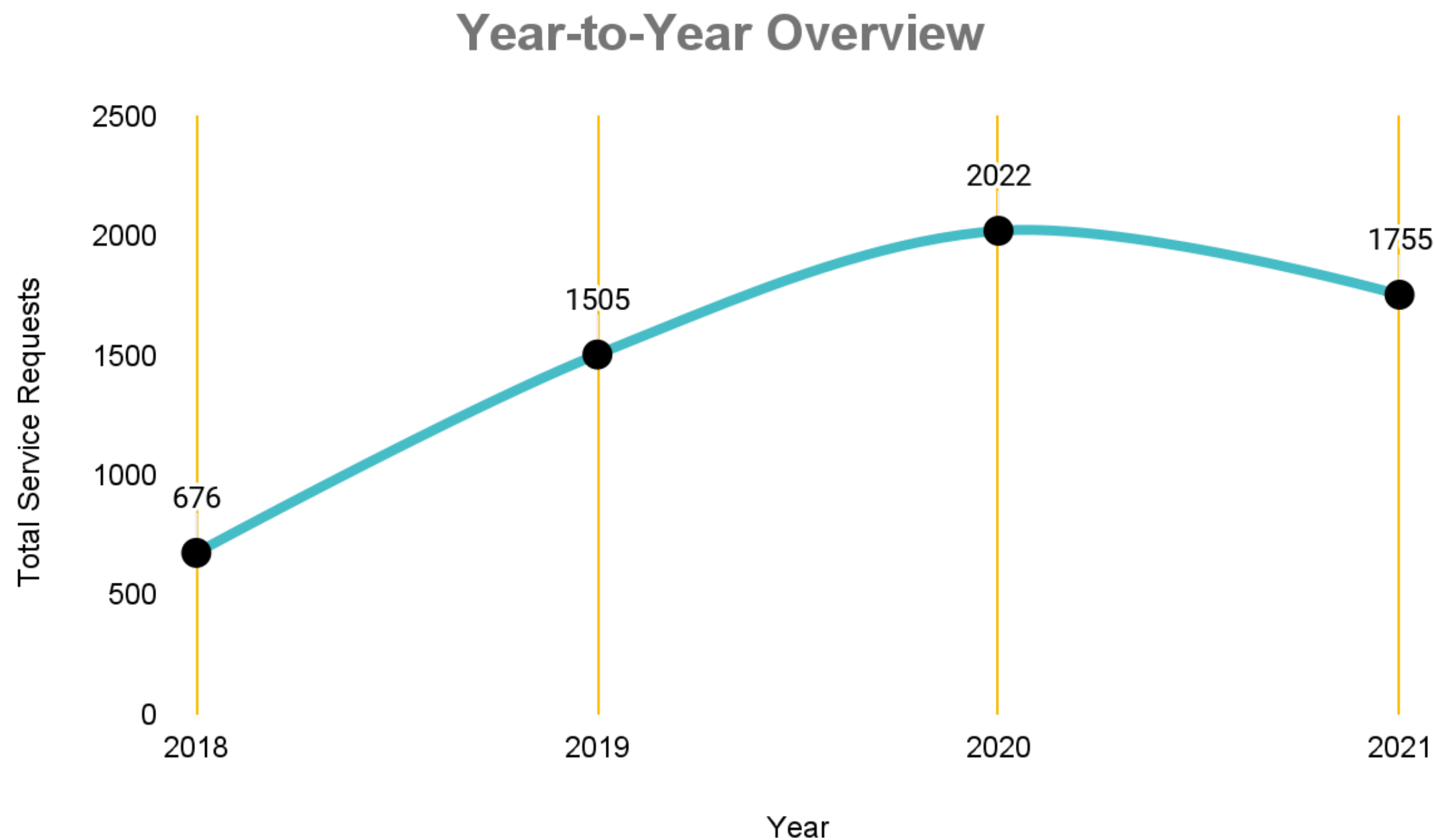

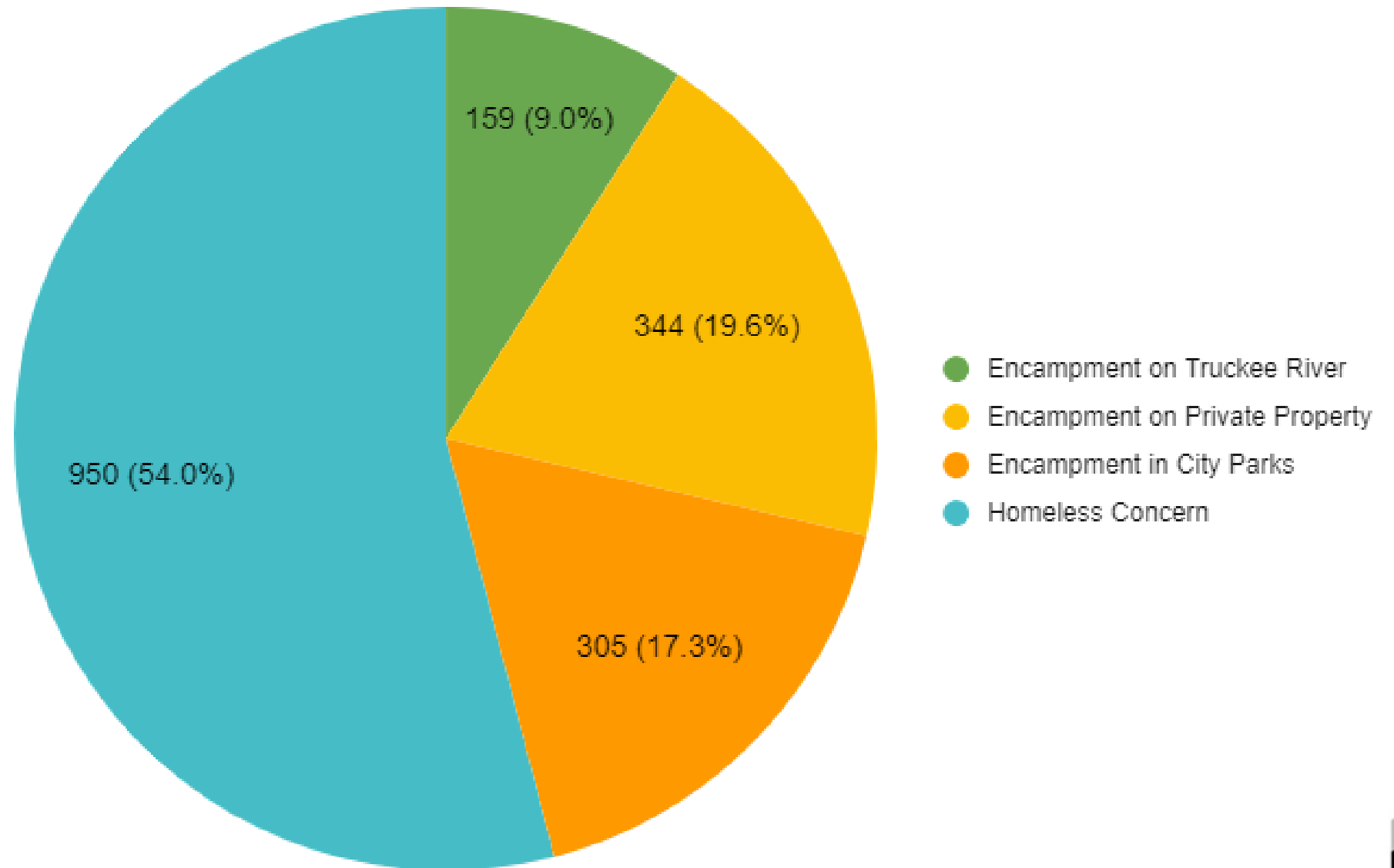
