There was no response to the call for public comment; no emails had been submitted prior to the meeting.

3. **APPROVAL OF MARCH 17, 2022, MINUTES** [For Possible Action] – Committee members may identify any additions or corrections to the draft minutes as transcribed.

Ed Atwell, UNR moved to approve the minutes as written. Jenn Felter, Washoe County, seconded the motion. There was no response to the call for Committee or public comment. Upon a call for a vote, the motion carried unanimously.

4. **ELECTION OF OFFICERS** [For Possible Action]

a. **Vice-chair**

Tracy Moore, Reno-Tahoe Airport Authority, nominated Chris Ketring, Truckee Meadows Fire Protection District for Vice-chair. Mr. Ketring declined the nomination sharing due to staffing changes within his organization, we would not be the representative after this meeting.

Ed Atwell, UNR, nominated Tracy Moore, Reno-Tahoe Airport Authority, for Vice-chair. Mr. Moore declined the nomination noting concern with a conflict of interest between Users and JOC. No action was taken on this item.

5. **DISTRIBUTED ANTENNA SYSTEMS (DAS) & BI-DIRECTIONAL AMPLIFIERS (BDA) INFORMATION SESSION** [For Discussion Only] – A review and discussion of In Building Coverage, and the needs and uses of extended coverage of the Radio System with Distributed Antenna Systems and Bi-Directional Amplifier. *Jerry Daniszewski and Brian Justin, L3 Harris Engineers*

Brian Justin, Lead RF Engineer, L3 Harris, reviewed the presentation for this item ([Item 5 - Distributed Antenna Systems \(DAS\) & Bi-Directional Amplifiers \(BDA\) Information Session \(washoecounty.gov\)](#)).

The presentation covered:

- What is a BDA and what do they do?
- What types are there?
- When are they desired/applicable?
- What requirements/standards must be met?
 - ex: FCC Registration
 - ex: NFPA Standards

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- What minimum technical specifications are applicable to P25 BDAs

[Robert Allen, City of Reno, joined the meeting at 10:17 a.m.]

There was discussion of the need for and process to register devices with the FCC ([FCC Signal Booster Registration - Part 90 Class B Signal Booster Registration & Discovery](#)). The WCRCS team has been working with the local vendors to ensure awareness of the need to plan for the P25 system and to meet certification standards. There is also coordination to test the system in advance of the Fire Marshal's review prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy. A procedure is being developed to help smooth the process and eventually develop a map to help resolve signal issues. Both systems will be run in tandem for some time; once the old system is turned off, BDAs that haven't been upgraded will become useless; there have been issues with getting building owners to upgrade existing information.

Ms. Lawney shared that there have been unforeseen issues moving toward P25 implementation such as the impacts on click-to-enter boxes to access apartment complexes. The goal is to share with this group as they are encountered to help with the transition. It was planned to also provide a website with system information, vendor information and technical specifications and shell RFPs if possible.

Prior to starting the one-touch updates, the team is aiming to develop a standard starting personality to reduce the number of current personalities.

James Schmidt, City of Reno Fire Department, shared the Reno Fire code has been updated to adopt the NFPA BDA standard noting the huge safety impact. It is meant to be retroactive but currently is focused on new construction. For their click-to-enters, they have moved to a conventional channel with a shortcut though noting all sites had to be updated.

Tracy Moore, Reno-Tahoe Airport Authority, shared the importance to remember law enforcement radio coverage in addition to fire.

- 6. LID (LOGICAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER) STATUS UPDATE & RADIO COUNTS** [Non-action item] – An ongoing review and discussion on the issue of limited LID availability on the current contractual obligations of our end users and current remaining radio counts. Washoe County Regional Communication System. *Melissa Lawney, Washoe County Technology Services*

Melissa Lawney, Washoe County Technology Services reviewed her presentation reviewing the current status of LIDs sharing there continues to be less available than requested and that a minimum of twenty need to be held for the cutover. For any agency with staff that is largely stationary, with a reliable internet or cell phone connection may be candidates for the BeOn Mobile application. The application can be used on a PC, table, or phone though not currently recommended for iPhone users. Phone calls can't be made while using the application with phone and there is considerable battery draw. She reviewed the features of the application and provided a demonstration. It was unknown if bay stations could be moved to the app. BeOn licenses are half the price of a LID.

It was planned for an upcoming meeting to have a review of how to access the feature list for each type of radio and providing the feature codes to decipher the models that don't display the information clearly, such as the 75P and 75PE.

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Ed Atwell, UNR, suggested separately scheduled working sessions to allow people to meet and offered to help with securing a location large enough for group, if needed.




