3. APPROVAL OF SEPTEMBER 15, 2022, MINUTES [For Possible Action] — Committee members may identify any additions or corrections to the draft minutes as transcribed.

Austin Mills, Washoe County School District, moved to approve the minutes as written; Robert Allen, City of Reno, provided the second. There was no response to the call for Committee or public comment. Upon a call for the vote, the motion carried unanimously.

4. FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024 WCRCS (WASHOE COUNTY REGIONAL COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM) BUDGET [For Possible Action] – A review, discussion, and possible action to recommend that the 800MHz Joint Operating Committee approve the fiscal year 2023/2024 WCRCS Budget. Quinn Korbulic & Melissa Lawney, Washoe County Technology Services

Quinn Korbulic, Washoe County Technology Services, reviewed his <u>staff report</u>, the proposed <u>FY24 budget</u> and <u>agency contribution comparison</u>.

WCRCS FY23/24 Proposed Budget Highlights

Overview of Budget Proposal:

- · Total Radio Count increase of 208.5
- · 2.9% Operations budget increase over FY22 23.
- Staff continues to recommend the 10% contribution for Infrastructure enhancement.
 - Cost per radio decrease of \$1.14 per radio per year to \$255.87 (Operations only).

Operations:

- Total Operations Budget: \$1,812,813.31
- Operations Budget increase: \$45,524.18
- Covers 4.75 FTE staff including the Regional Communications Coordinator, a Sr. Network Engineer, and two Network Engineers.

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
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Mills, Washoe County School District, provided the second. There was no response to the call for public comment. Upon a call for a vote, the motion carried unanimously.

5. LID (LOGICAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER) STATUS UPDATE & RADIO COUNTS [Non-action item] – An ongoing review and status update on the issue of limited LID availability on the current contractual obligations of our end users and current remaining radio counts. Washoe County Regional Communication System. *Melissa Lawney, Washoe County Technology Services*

Melissa Lawney, Washoe County Technology Services reviewed her <u>presentation</u> (slides 1-4) reviewing the current status of LIDs, radio purchase progress, Harris sales representative contact information. Agencies are being asked to audit their fleets and LIDs are being issued on a case-by-case basis.

Harris is expected to be onsite beginning December 2022 beginning the 14-month window they will be available for programming and installations. The current contracted pricing will be available for one year after final system acceptance (~2026).



6. SYSTEM STATUS UPDATE [Non-action item] – An informational update on the operational status of the 800 MHz Communication System. *Melissa Lawney, Washoe County Technology Services*

Melissa Lawney, Washoe County Technology Services reviewed her <u>presentation</u> (slides 6-10) reviewing the System Status Update focusing on microwave installations and related planned outages, the core and software updates, Cold Springs site construction status, and the Radio Shop move. No further outages are planned for this year. Radio programming was discussed including use of channels and shortcuts. Agencies were encouraged to plan radio purchase timing to ensure contract pricing. The videos that the Radio Shop team had prepared were appreciated and found helpful.

7. WASHOE COUNTY REGIONAL COMMUNICATION SYSTEM INFASTRUCTURE MAINTENANCE AND REPLACEMENT UPDATE [Non-action item] – A review of maintenance

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and replacement needs for WCRCS Infrastructure. *Melissa Lawney, Washoe County Technology Services*

Melissa Lawney, Washoe County Technology Services reviewed her <u>presentation</u> (slides 11-15) providing updates on system maintenance focusing on battery replacement, Dehydrator/Waveguide pressure testing, and inspections and repairs of HVAC, generators, towers, radios, security cameras, and interference. There was discussion of the generation at the Slide Mountain site. The goal is to over time replace and standardize the generators with regular review of lifespan and availability of parts. The interference issues were investigated with the help of an outside vendor. 35 bi-directional amplifiers were visited; 13 were turned off, 12 were fixed and one is awaiting review by the FCC.

8. IN-BUILDING COVERAGE INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATE [Non-action item] – A review of inbuilding radio coverage infrastructure, to include but not be limited to: FCC licensing requirements, registration requirements, and various technologies related to in-building radio system coverage. *Melissa Lawney, Washoe County Technology Services*

Melissa Lawney, Washoe County Technology Services reviewed her <u>presentation</u> (slides 16-18) detailing the proposed process to ensure bi-directional amplifier (BDA) registration with Washoe County and the FCC, including an in-building coverage responsibility flow chart. Ms. Lawney invited others to consider participating in the Safer Building Coalition with free membership for public agencies.
