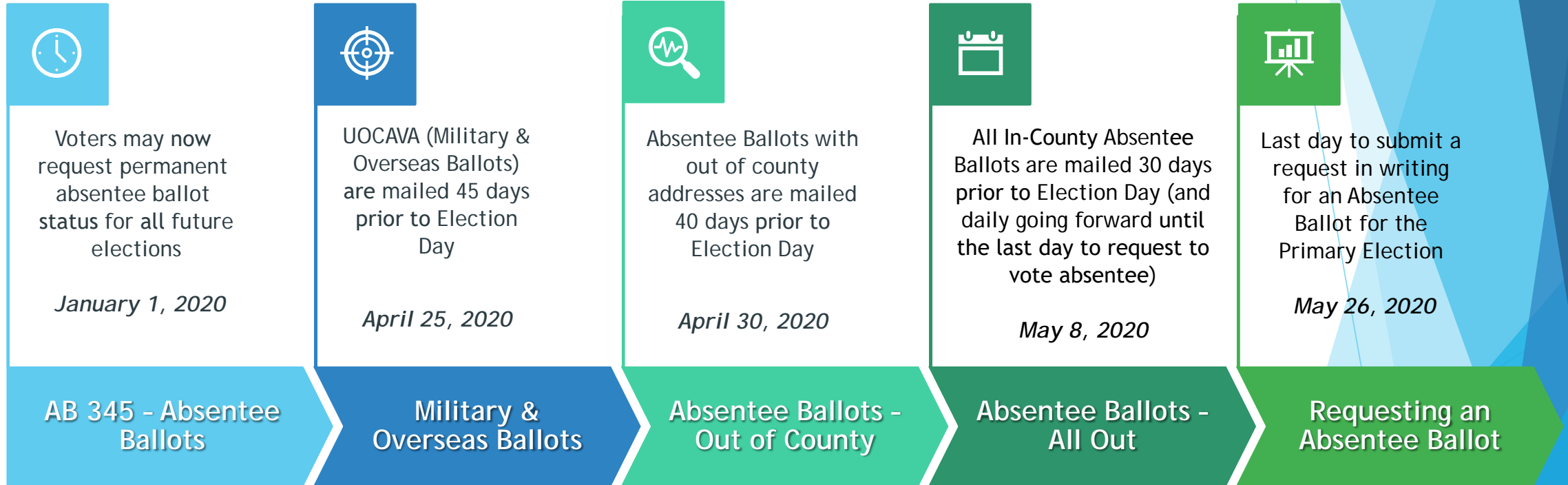


# Absentee/Mail-In Ballots



Voters may now request permanent absentee ballot status for any reason by submitting a written request to the Office of the Registrar of Voters.

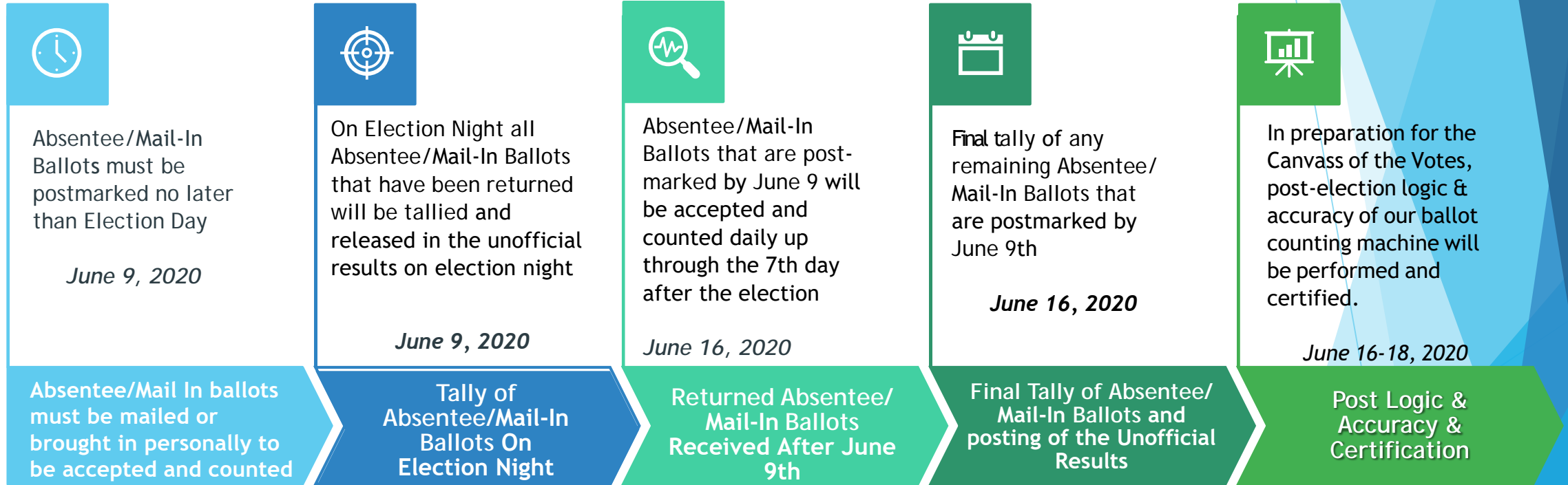
**NOTE:** If you have requested permanent absentee ballot status and you surrender your paper ballot to vote at a polling location, your permanent status may be removed and you will need to resubmit your request again to reinstate your permanent status.

After the last day to request an absentee ballot and you have been called away from work, have been injured or hospitalized, or have another qualifying event, you may be eligible to request and vote an emergency ballot.

# Absentee/Mail-In Ballots

**NOTE:** Do Not take your voted absentee/mail-in ballot to a polling location. Polling places cannot accept voted ballots on your behalf.

Absentee/Mail-In ballots will be processed daily during this period and reporting of updated unofficial results will be posted at the end of each day up through June 16, 2020.

Post Election Logic & Accuracy Testing, Reconciliation, and processing of eligible provisional ballots will be completed for the canvass of the vote on June 19, 2020 for the Primary Elections.
